Several parents (14%) who did not agree or strongly agree with this statement identified that this was due to the restrictions we currently under due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Children are usually offered the opportunity to attend various sports events at QEGS throughout the year, some of these are during school and some are after school. We are looking forward to being able to continue with these events once the COVID-19 pandemic is under control.

Following parent requests we are now offering piano lessons on a Wednesday afternoon. If you would like your child(ren) to receive piano lessons please contact school for more information.

Once the pandemic is under control we can investigate offering other clubs / activities. If there is a particular club or activity you would like to see on offer please let me know. Our difficulty with offering additional clubs and activities is that we have to reach minimum numbers for a club to take place.

# The school supports my child's wider personal development

At school the children take part in PSHE lessons. The PSHE Matters scheme we use aims to help pupils lead confident, healthy, independent lives. Throughout the day, as different things occur (e.g. fall outs with friends), we talk to the children about making the right choice and the choice they should have made.

We also refer to British Values regularly (at least once a week) and remind the children how we live these at our school. The British values are – Democracy, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty, Mutual Respect and Tolerance of people with different faiths and beliefs.
